

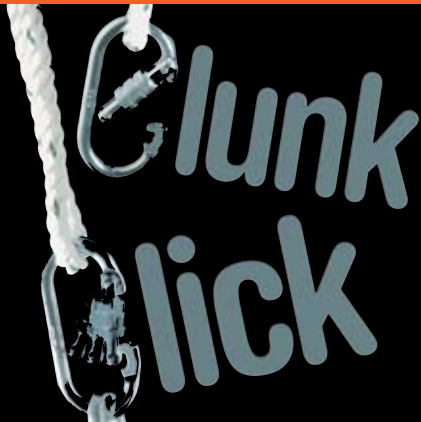

WHAT IS IPAF ...



Since 1983 the International Powered Access Federation (IPAF) has been responsible for many safety initiatives operating within the powered access industry, and has played a key role in the formation of relevant European legislation.



IPAF training courses, are recognised across the world and have been developed through working closely with the Health & Safety Executive (HSE) and the Construction Plant Hire Association (CPA). IPAF qualifications are recognised by the Major Contractors Group (MCG) as acceptable training for contractors to operate powered access machinery on site.

WHAT TRAINING DO I NEED ...

There are many different categories of training available, which can be tailored to specific types of machinery, including:

- Operator courses for Static Verticals (1a)
- Operator courses for Static Booms (1b)
- Operator courses for Mobile Verticals (3a)
- Operator courses for Mobile Booms (3b)
- Competent Assessed Persons (CAP)
- Safe Loading & Unloading
- MEWP's for Managers
- Demonstrator
- Harness

WHAT'S AWARDED IF SUCCESSFUL ...

The courses provide successful delegates, with an IPAF PAL (Powered Access Licence) card, which is valid for 5 years, together with a certificate and log book, in which the delegate is able to log the various qualifications attained.

WHAT IS PASMA ...



The Prefabricated Access Suppliers' and Manufacturers' Association (PASMA) was formed in 1974 to promote the safe use of alloy access towers and the interests of its members to the regulatory and standards authorities.

Originally devised in the 1980s, the PASMA Code of Practice has been completely updated to incorporate the requirements of the Work at Height Regulations 2005 and, like the PASMA Training Course, has become universally acknowledged as the definitive industry standard for users of alloy towers.

- Introduction to Mobile Access Towers
- Safe Operation and Limitations of Use
- Regulations and Standards
- Tower Inspection, Care & Maintenance
- Theory and Practise
- Safe Use of Towers
- Tower Assembly

- Tower Dismantling

WHAT IS LMA ...



Formed in 1947, The Ladder Manufacturers' Association (LMA), today welcomes members from every part of the access industry, and advances best practice, as well as playing an integral role in promoting the highest standards of ladder design and manufacture.

The need for a clear and concise interpretation of the 2005 Work at Height Regulations (WAHR) has resulted in the introduction of a range of LMA initiatives, including training for users, supervisors and managers who wish to use ladders legally and safely.

The LMA standard course covers:

- Selecting Appropriate Equipment For a Task
- Assess Applications Appropriate To Use
- Correct Location Of Ladders & Step Ladders
- Inspection For Damage Of Ladders & Step Ladders
- Regulations & Legislation
- Standards & Classifications
- Hazards
