### WHO SHOULD ATTEND

This course is designed for any delegate who has attended the five day Site Management Safety Training Scheme Course since 1 January 2001, and whose certificate is due to expire (5 years). Those who completed training prior to this date are advised to attend, however it is not mandatory to do so.

### AIM

The two day refresher course aims to:

- ◆ Improve awareness of recent developments in construction, legislation and health, safety, welfare and environmental issues.
- ◆ Identify measures that will assist the practical implementation of responsibilities established by new legislation and new working practices.

Renewal of the nationally recognised Construction Site Managers Safety certificate (valid 5 years) will be awarded to those persons who successfully complete the course including the compulsory final examination (80% pass grade).
